

Supplemental Learning Materials: \$martPath Good Boy Video



In the video **Good Boy (Goods v. Services)**, Timmy and Tammy adopt a new dog from a pet rescue. They soon learn it requires many different goods and services to be a good pet owner.

Economic wants are wishes or desires that can be fulfilled by purchasing a good or service. A **good** is something people want that they can touch or hold. A **service** is an action that a person does for someone else.



Discussion Questions:

A good is something you can touch. What are some of the goods that Timmy and Tammy want to buy for their dog Good Boy?

A: Dog treats, leash, collar, water bowl, fancy dog bed.

A service is something someone does for someone else. What are some of the services that Timmy and Tammy want to buy for Good Boy?

A: Dog training, dog walker, dog sitter, veterinarian.

Toy – Good

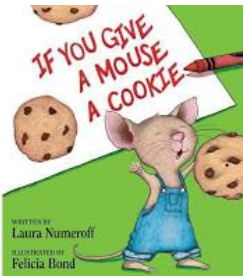

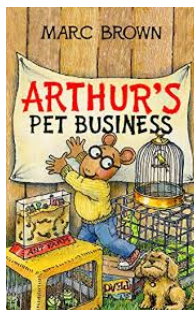

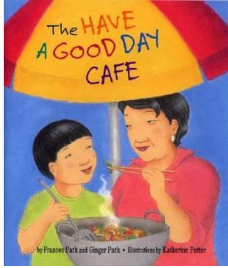
If You Give A Mouse A Cookie by Laura Numeroff
