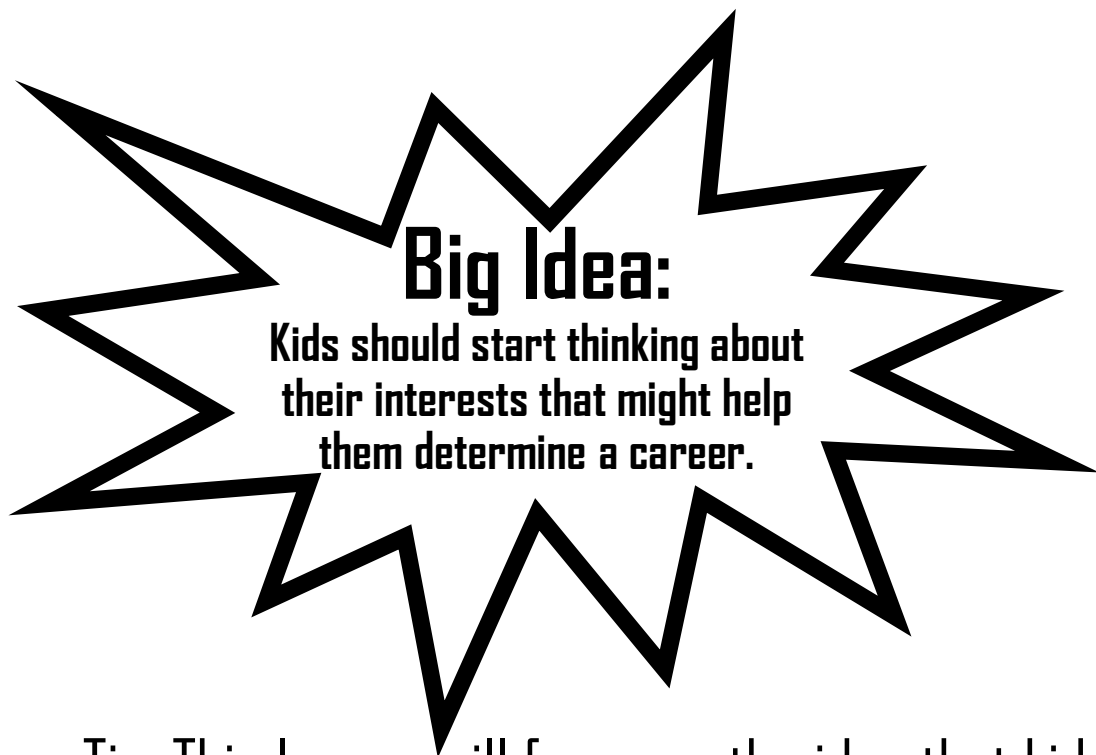




Level 8, Lesson 1 Adapted Guide Level A



Teacher Tip: This lesson will focus on the idea that kids can start to think about their interests early and what careers their interests might lead them to. It also focuses on the fact that different careers require different levels of education and get paid at different rates. There is a lot to think about when choosing a career.

This lesson has three vocabulary terms for students to focus on. These terms are **supply, demand, and career**. These terms will help students to understand why a career may make more or less money, and why a career requires more or less education. Defining career will be helpful for students.

The adapted lessons include a memory game with different careers and the skills/education requirements. And a chart to cut and paste careers students are interested in and not interested in to start to think about their future.

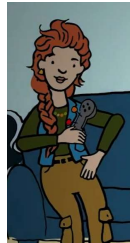

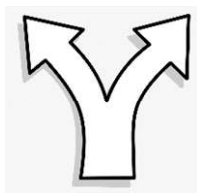
